
*Hotel check-in time is <u>4 PM</u> and check-out is <u>11 AM</u>.



Qualifying Scores

Qualifying scores for both quartets and choruses have increased for 2024. The quartet qualifying score is 69 (828), with a cutoff score for inviting alternates of 67 (804). The chorus qualifying score is 68 (816), with a cutoff score for inviting alternates of 66 (792).

Contest Schedules

• The Contest Schedules will be completed and approved shortly. Once approved, the schedules will be sent to all Quartets and the Director and President of each competing Chorus. The schedules will also be posted on the <u>Area 3 website</u>.

Contestant Briefing

• The briefing is Friday **12:30 pm** in the Ballroom. Each quartet must attend and each chorus must send a representative. Quartet stage awareness will immediately follow the briefing.

Quartet Stage Awareness

- Quartet stage awareness is Friday **1:00 pm** (or immediately following the Briefing). We will be asking everyone to exit the ballroom immediately after the Briefing.
- Quartets will line up at the stage door (outside the ballroom) in order of appearance. Our stage manager (Teri Allred) will call each quartet into the stage area. You will have 2 minutes on stage. You may sing or use your time however you would like. As soon as TIME is called, please exit stage right and leave the ballroom as quickly as possible.
- You may bring a coach, who may enter the backstage area with your quartet and who will be directed out front.

Chorus Stage Awareness

• Chorus Stage viewing will be held on Saturday morning 8:00 am to 8:50 am. Only **FIVE** members of each chorus may attend the viewing. No singing. Each chorus will have five minutes and will be given a specific timeslot. Timeslots will be listed on the chorus contest schedule that will be published shortly.

Chorus Warm-Up Rooms

- We do not have enough rooms to give each chorus their own warm-up room. However, each chorus will get 90 minutes in a warm-up room before being taken directly to the stage. You do NOT have to use all 90 minutes, but you <u>MUST</u> be in the warm-up room ready to walk to the stage. The timings will be listed in the contest schedule that will be published shortly.
- Please remember that the "2 minute" warning means "Please stop singing and get ready to start walking".
- Other choruses may be using the warm-up room AFTER you, so please do not leave anything in the rooms as you cannot interrupt a chorus that is warming up.

Stage/Risers

- Risers are six, six-foot risers with four steps, a back and side rails.
- Enter stage left and exit stage right. This is the opposite of what we are used to doing.
- Since we have no platform stage, there will be bright green tape to show where the performance line is. Please stay in front of the line.
- There will be NO stage curtain. Each chorus package starts when the director signals the Presenter for the introduction. Quartet packages begin when the Presenter introduces each quartet.

Photo/Video Forms

- ALL video forms must be mailed to John Aviste prior to AC&C
- Quartet photo forms should be given to the photographer at photo time
- Chorus photo forms will be collected following the Contestant Briefing (Friday 12:30 pm)

Chorus Photos (on stage)

• Chorus photos will be taken on the stage IMMEDIATELY AFTER your chorus has finished singing. Please plan your photo pose ahead of time and be prepared to go into that pose immediately after taking your applause. Four photos will be taken and the photographer will let you know when she has finished taking the photos.

Quartet Photos

• Quartet photos will be in a separate room prior to the warm-up room.

Evaluations

• Evaluation times and locations will be announced at contest by the ADM (Administrative Judge).



AC&C 2024 EDUCATION CLASSES

<u>DoubleTree by Hilton Syracuse – East Syracuse, NY</u> <u>Sunday, May 5, 2024</u>

Classes are held in the Adams Basin and Bushnells Basin rooms. The Quartet Development Room will be held in Dewitt Basin.

<u>9:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.</u>

Class 1: Listening vs Hearing, Watching vs Believing - It's All About Performance! – with Angie Dolber (Certified Performance Judge). In this class we'll talk about the basics of the Performance Category and how the other two categories can enhance the performance experience as well. By looking at various performances, and even trying a little ourselves, we'll talk about words like artistry, authenticity, and how you can truly entertain the audience. *Location: Bushnells Basin*

Class 2: Getting Out of the Rut – with Cary Burns (Certified Music Judge). Getting out of a rut is different than simply improving. Breaking free of our usual patterns is often the first step in improvement. Have you ever worked hard to get better, but feel like you're not breaking through to the next level? Have you focused on excelling in contest to find that you are getting approximately the same scores? Do you rehearse the same way each week? This class will examine ruts and how we can free ourselves from them so we can create new paths. *Location: Adams Basin*

QUARTET DEVELOPMENT ROOM

Have you ever wanted to try out quartet singing but weren't sure how to start? Come by the Quartet Development Room to meet other members looking for potential quartets and sing some tags together! We'll be teaching a few easy tags, giving you a fun and easy way to quickly try out a little taste of quartet harmony. *Location: Dewitt Basin*

<u>10:10 a.m. – 11:10 a.m.</u>

Class 1: **LET'S RING SOME CHORDS!** – Wendy McCoole (Certified Judge). In this hands-on class we will dive into the different SNG elements – intonation, vocal quality, unity, expansion, and vocal expression – to gain a better understanding of the importance of each to (and things that get in the way of) ringing those barbershop chords. *Location: Bushnells Basin*

Class 2: **Membership Growth: How to attract new singers to your chorus!** – with Adele Merritt (Certified Music Judge). Are you ready to share your great chorus with interested singers in your area? Are you wondering how to grow your membership? Come and join this class to find out how the Valley Voices A Cappella Chorus in Area 1 generated massive membership growth in just two years, blossoming from 24 members on the risers in March 2022 to 66 members in March 2024! *Location: Adams Basin*

<u>11:20 a.m. – 12:20 p.m.</u>

Class 1: Where All Women Can Belong: A Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging Roundtable – with Anita Prather Harvell (Area 3 Public Relations Coordinator and Webmaster). Harmony, Inc. members and chorus leaders are invited to participate in a roundtable discussion on strategies to create a more inclusive musical environment.

The group will collaborate on topics such as (subject to change):

- What expectations do singers have concerning diverse relationships in their performing groups?
- How do we create welcoming spaces for those new to our organization?
- Speaking the language: Common terms in DEI, access and belonging efforts
- Why do we need to incorporate DEI into our chorus culture?

Panel members TBD. Participants are invited to submit questions prior to the session for discussion. *Location: Bushnells Basin*

Class 2: **The Mysterious Voice** – with Jen Wheaton (Certified Singing Judge). Ever wonder what the "voice box" is? What is a Larynx? Or is it pronounced "larnyx"? Is there a difference between vocal cord and vocal fold? Do I absolutely have to breathe to sing? What is "support"?? As human beings, we naturally learn to use our voices, but we don't necessarily learn how it all works. To better understand what coaches and directors are asking us to do with our voices, it's really helpful to know what it all is and how it works. Bring your nerd-selves to this class and you will learn all about it! *Location: Adams Basin*
